If you're a history buff, you've come to the right place. Our nation's pioneer legacy is more than a page in a dusty textbook – here, it comes to life.

Spend a day wandering through one of our many museums, exploring an authentic 19th century sod house, or taking a walk along the ruts made by original Oregon Trail wagon trains.

With over 1,000 acres in which to hike, bike, camp, picnic, and sightsee, the Wildcat Hills State Recreation area south of Gering surprises most first time visitors. With acres of Ponderosa pines, miles of scenic vistas and nature trails, and (rumor has it) a wildcat or two, it's not your typical walk in the park.

Closer to home, a 1.6 mile walking trail runs from the Scotts Bluff National Monument visitor center to the top of the 800 ft. bluff, so hikers can exercise and experience history at the same time.

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Hunting/Fishing

- Anglers fish for trout, walleye, perch, northern pike, bluegill, and catfish in area lakes and streams.

Watersports

You probably wouldn't expect to see sandy beaches in western Nebraska, but that's exactly what you'll find. The 2,100 acre Lake Minatare is just 10 miles from Scottsbluff and features both primitive and modern campgrounds, boat ramps and docks, and plenty of room for motorized boating, jet skies, and sailing.
